## Biography Nashen Moodley Sydney Film Festival Director

2013 marks Nashen Moodley's second year as Festival Director of the Sydney Film Festival. His first year at the helm was a record-breaking year for SFF with attendances at films and talks growing by 10% to 122,000.

Other key highlights in his first year included the introduction of the new free public space **Festival Hub at the Lower Town Hall** and the **World Premiere** of **Mabo**, which was attended by real-life protagonist **Bonita Mabo** and received an emotional reception and standing ovation.

Moodley's impressive career in film programming has encompassed leadership roles as Manager and Head of Programming at South Africa's **Durban International Film Festival** (2001–2011) and Tehran's first South African Film Festival (2006). Moodley also consults as Director of AsiaAfrica Programs for **Dubai International Film Festival** (2008–present).

During Moodley's 11 years at Durban International Film Festival - South Africa's longest running film festival- he was responsible for expanding the content and reach of the festival. He also raised the profile of the African film industry by establishing the **Durban FilmMart**, a program that provides African filmmakers with the opportunity to pitch film projects to leading financiers.

In addition to programming, Moodley has served as advisor to India's International Film Festival of Kerala, South Korea's Busan International Film Festival and Africala in Mexico City. Moodley has also worked as an Industry Consultant at the International Film Festival Rotterdam, and as an expert at the Berlinale Talent Campus.

Born in South Africa in 1978, Moodley studied English and Philosophy at the University of Natal and worked as a journalist before turning to film. His film writing and criticism has appeared in newspapers and magazines including **GQ**, **The Sunday Tribune**, **The Sunday Independent**, and **Mail&Guardian**.
