Sydney Film Festival is back! This iconic Festival celebrates world cinema, but it is also an iconic celebration of Sydney.





FESTIVAL AVVARDS

THE OFFICIAL COMPETITION AND SYDNEY FILM PRIZE

A prize awarded to the most "audacious, cutting edge and courageous" film in the Official Competition. Endorsed by FIAPF, the regulating body for international film festivals, this prize is judged by a jury of international and Australian industry professionals, who award a \$60,00 prize to the winning filmmaker.

The 2024 Official Competition Jury is led by Bosnian writer and director Danis Tanović as Jury President, joined by Indonesian director Kamila Andini, Australian producer Sheila Jayadev, US producer Jay Van Hoy, and Australian director Tony Krawitz.

FIRST NATIONS AWARD

Announced in February 2024, the inaugural First Nations Award is proudly supported by Truant Pictures with the world's largest cash prize for Indigenous filmmaking, \$35,000. Open to First Nations filmmakers from across the globe, the First Nations Award celebrates the profound contributions of First Nations filmmakers to the cinematic landscape. Any eligible film, including short films, featured within the Festival's First Nations program automatically qualifies for consideration for the Award.





DOCUMENTARY AUSTRALIA AWARD

Supported by Documentary Australia, this prize acknowledges excellence in Australian documentary production. As well as receiving a \$20,000 cash prize, the winning film becomes Academy Award eligible.



SUSTAINABLE FUTURE AWARD

The Sustainable Future Award, with a cash prize of \$40,000, is the largest environmental film prize in the world. It is made possible through philanthropic support from a syndicate of passionate climate activists. The Award recognises a narrative or documentary film of any length that deepens our knowledge and awareness of the impact of the global climate emergency.





2024 SYDNEY UNESCO CITY OF FILM AWARD

This annual award recognises a trailblazing NSW-based screen practitioner whose work stands for innovation, imagination and high impact. Screen NSW awards a \$10,000 cash prize to the winner at SFF's Closing Night ceremony on Sunday 16 June.





DINOSAUR DESIGNS

All Sydney Film Festival Award winners are presented with the Festival's signature mesmeric swirl award, designed and handmade in Sydney by SFF's partners Louise Olsen and Stephen Ormandy of Dinosaur Designs.

DENDY AWARDS FOR AUSTRALIAN SHORT FILMS

SFF's prestigious Australian Short Film Awards were established in 1970 and have been sponsored by Dendy Cinemas since 1989.

- The Dendy Live Action Short Award, sponsored by Dendy Cinemas, provides a \$7,000 cash prize to the best Australian short fiction film. Winners are Academy Award eligible.
- The Rouben Mamoulian Award, sponsored by Dendy Cinemas and named after the director who first presented the award in 1974, provides a \$7,000 cash prize to the best direction of an Australian short film



 The Yoram Gross Animation Award, sponsored by Sandra and Guy Gross in memory of the late Yoram Gross, provides a \$7,000 cash prize to the best Australian animated short film. Winners are Academy Award eligible.



 The AFTRS Craft Award, sponsored by the Australian Film Television and Radio School, provides a \$7,000 cash prize for demonstrated excellence by a craft practitioner in an Australian short film.



 The Event Cinemas Rising Talent Award recognises an emerging short filmmaker with a cash prize of \$7,000. Open to film creatives, directors and screenwriters who have had no more than five short film credits.



The first Indian film to appear in the Cannes Competition in 30 years, Payal Kapadia's dreamy romantic drama follows two women in Mumbai who are thwarted in their quests for love but retain hope.

Diligent nurse Prabha works in a busy hospital where she is also responsible for the training of new nurses. Her roommate is Anu, a younger fellow nurse. One day, Prabha receives the unexpected gift of a rice cooker from her estranged husband, who has worked abroad for many years. The gift causes her an inordinate amount of distress, forcing her to reflect on her marriage, and on the clear romantic interest of a doctor at the hospital. Meanwhile, Anu struggles to find a spot in the city to be intimate with her boyfriend, who is of a different religion. A trip to a beach town to help a friend provides an opportunity for both women to express their desires. Kapadia won the Golden Eye for Best Documentary at Cannes in 2021 for her hybrid film, A Night of Knowing Nothing. Here, in her first fiction film, she delivers on that great promise. Kapadia captures the city of Mumbai in an observational and dreamlike manner, revelling in the lives and dreams of two women in their search for love.



Payal Kapadia is a filmmaker based in Mumbai. A graduate of the Film and Television Institute of India, her shorts have been previously selected at Cinéfondation and the Berlinale. Kapadia's debut feature A Night of Knowing Nothing was selected for Cannes Directors' Fortnight 2021, where it won the Golden Eye for Best Documentary.

Winner of the Silver Bear in Berlin, this multi-generational epic follows a conductor and his turbulent family. Equally funny and poignant, it's anchored by a superb performance from Lars Eidinger (Personal Shopper, SFF 2016).

Eidinger plays Tom Lunies, a conductor in Berlin who is busy with a new composition, called 'Sterben' - or 'Dying' - written by his close and increasingly unstable friend Bernard (Robert Gwisdek). Tom is on the verge of fatherhood; his ex-girlfriend wishes him to co-parent her child, even though he is not the biological father. Meanwhile Tom's hard-partying sister, Ellen (Lilith Stangenberg), has just embarked on an affair with a married colleague (Ronald Zehrfeld; Barbara, SFF 2012), and rarely checks in on the pair's aged parents, Lissy and Gerd (Corinna Harfouch and Hans-Uwe Bauer). But the chaos and indignities of life make a family reunion unavoidable. Brilliantly performed by the ensemble, *Dying* is an exceptionally emotional film that, in

Direct from the Cannes Competition, the latest from Miguel Gomes (*Tabu*, SFF 2012; *Arabian Nights*, Sydney Film Prize, SFF 2015) is a melancholic and mischievous chronicle of a romantic pursuit across Asia.

Rangoon, Burma, 1917. A British civil servant, Edward (Gonçalo Waddington) is due to be married to his fiancée Molly (Crista Alfaiate), who has arrived from London for the wedding. But Edward panics before the nuptials and flees to Singapore. So begins his grand tour of Asia — whizzing through Bangkok, Manila, Saigon, Osaka and Shanghai. Molly is not easily dissuaded, however; determined to be married, she's even rather amused by Edward's cowardly skittishness. She sets off in pursuit, often narrowly missing her betrothed and sending telegrams notifying him of her progress. The word "stop" in her telegrams is both punctuation and an order. And while on the trail, Molly, with her boisterous laugh, is not short of admirers. With hilarious voiceover narration, and the dazzlingly beautiful and meticulous period scenes intercut with vibrant contemporary footage, Gomes has once again made a film that is funny, unique and beguiling.



Miguel Gomes is a Lisbon-based Portuguese director. His films *Our Beloved Month of August* (2008), *Tabu* (SFF 2012), *Arabian Nights* (winner of the Sydney Film Prize, SFF 2015), and *The Tsugua Diaries* (2019) have played at festivals around the world including at Cannes and the Berlinale.

Rich Peppiatt's raucous, rude and riotously entertaining comedy stars three real-life Belfast rappers as themselves – and Michael Fassbender. Audience Award, Sundance NEXT strand.

Peppiatt's powerfully political comedy-drama about the survival of the Irish language is something of a miracle movie. Where else in the world could the legacy of trauma produce such hilarity and crowd-pleasing entertainment? Liam Óg Ó hAnnaidh and Naoise Ó Cairealláin play themselves wonderfully in the origin story of their Belfast rap group Kneecap. We first meet them in the 2010s as drug-selling besties. More importantly, they're staunch patriots who speak Irish as an act of cultural maintenance, and in defiance of British imperialism. When nerdy music teacher JJ Ó Dochartaigh enters the scene, he encourages the lads to turn their notebook scribblings into highly charged polemical rap songs (and becomes their DJ). What follows is a rowdy and cheerfully rude showbiz story following the trio through drug-hazed nights and clear-eyed days, as their music begins to impact the broader community while inevitably angering authorities. Subversive, sexy, unfiltered, and with a significant supporting role for Michael Fassbender, this freewheeling and finger-flipping music biopic hits all the right notes.

This Cannes Competition contender from Yorgos Lanthimos (*Alps*, Sydney Film Prize 2012; *Poor Things*) is a darkly hilarious triptych fable starring Emma Stone, Jesse Plemons and Willem Dafoe.


The opening chapter of *Kinds of Kindness* follows a man who appears to lead a very happy and successful life. But we soon learn that he is in an iron grip — when he rebels and tries to take back control, the odds are stacked against him. Elsewhere, a cop is relieved when his wife, lost at sea while conducting research, is rescued. But then he becomes convinced that she is not who she says she is — that a doppelganger has returned in her place. And further afield, a duo conducts a search for a person with a very particular skill to occupy an elevated position in a spiritual sect seemingly built on sex. Reuniting with writing collaborator Efthymis Filippou (*Dogtooth*, *The Lobster*), Lanthimos explores three transgressive and bizarre scenarios, with surreal twists and turns along the way. Stone, Plemons and Dafoe are joined by a brilliant group of players — Hong Chau, Joe Alwyn, Mamoudou Athie and Hunter Schafer — in these strange, surprising and subversive tales.

Yorgos Lanthimos is an internationally renowned filmmaker born in Athens, whose film *Alps* won the Sydney Film Prize in 2012. Lanthimos' filmography includes *Poor Things* (2023), *The Favourite* (2018), *The Lobster* (2015), and *Dogtooth* (2009), and he has received numerous accolades for his work – including the Jury Prize in Cannes and the Golden Lion in Venice.

MARCELLO MIO

Christophe Honoré's inventive Cannes Competition entry brings together an all-star French cast (playing themselves) in this charming and delightfully meta comedy paying homage to the great Marcello Mastrojanni.

Chiara Mastroianni, the daughter of Marcello Mastroianni (*La Dolce Vita*, 8½) and Catherine Deneuve (*Belle de Jour, The Umbrellas of Cherbourg*), is an actress disillusioned with the business. The shoot she's on is absolutely chaotic and unpleasant. When she auditions for a role in a new film, she's told by the director: "More Mastroianni than Deneuve ... More Marcello than Catherine." She starts to feel she might prefer to live her father's life, leading to Chiara beginning to dress and speak like him – and then insisting on being called Marcello. Her mother (Deneuve herself) reacts with bemusement and concern, but others (like actor Fabrice Luchini) go with the flow. Soon, Chiara is in Rome, retracing Marcello's steps but also on a path to re-finding herself. Reimagining some of Marcello Mastroianni's iconic roles, *Marcello Mio* is a playful depiction of the challenges and joys of the creative life under the shadow of famous parents.



Across a 45-year career 'The Oils' helped shape modern Australia with anthems like "US Forces", "Beds Are Burning" and "Redneck Wonderland". Featuring unseen footage and interviews with every band member, alongside signature moments including the outback tour with Warumpi Band, their Exxon protest gig in New York and those famous "Sorry" suits at the Sydney Olympics, *Midnight Oil: The Hardest Line* traces the journey of Australia's quintessential rock band.

"There is no other rock band in the world like Midnight Oil," Clarke said. "For half a century they were fearless, contrary, and totally original. When Australia was creaking under the weight of its own myths, they told us the truth. Their songs pinpoint the fault-lines in our culture, they rage against the strange and dangerous times we've lived through, and they offer hope."

Teenage sisters July (Mia Tharia) and September (Pascale Kann) are extremely close. So entwined that they seem to require no one else. They tolerate their single mother, Sheela (Rakhee Thakrar, *Sex Education*), but even at school, the duo's interactions with the other students are mostly acrimonious. Born just 10 months apart, September is extremely protective of July, but she also expects her sister to follow every instruction, however unreasonable. When July begins to exert her independence and acts on the attraction she feels for a boy at school, things take a bad turn. Mother and daughters decamp to an old family home in Ireland, where the bond between July and September takes on new, increasingly heightened dimensions. In her visually inventive, atmospheric and surreal debut, director Ariane Labed explores these familial ties — and a love so intense it transforms reality.



Ariane Labed is a director, screenwriter, and actress. Her debut performance in *Attenberg* (Athina Rachel Tsangari, SFF 2011) earned her the Volpi Cup for Best Actress at Venice Film Festival, and the next year she starred in *Alps*, winner of the Sydney Film Prize in 2012. Labed's debut short *OLLA* premiered at Cannes Director's Fortnight in 2019, and received the National Grand Prix at Clermont-Ferrand International Short Film Festival.

Puan is the name of the street on which the Faculty of Philosophy and Literature of the University of Buenos Aires is located. Marcelo (Marcelo Subiotto) has dedicated his life to teaching philosophy there — and to the service of his mentor, Professor Caselli. When Caselli dies suddenly, Marcelo expects to continue his legacy and be appointed his replacement. Enter Rafael (Leonardo Sbaraglia): handsome and charismatic, he returns from prestigious European universities and becomes an immediate competitor for the role. As the two men attempt to outdo each other, the institution appears to be on the verge of collapse, and maybe the nation around them is too. At once hilarious comedy and devastating portrait of an economy and nation on the brink, *Puan* poses vital questions about what is truly important. Directors María Alché and Benjamín Naishtat say: "We see this film as a complex and dynamic experience in which the audience participates in a kind of Chaplinesque hilarity while, at the same time, asking questions regarding identity, existence, [and] the future."

Winner of the Sundance Grand Jury Prize, *Sujo* is unlike anything you'd expect from a Mexican cartel drama, as it follows a cartel-born child from infancy to manhood in an epic life-affirming odyssey.

Sujo is orphaned when his assassin father is murdered by his own cartel. Even though he's only four, the boy is considered a liability, and the cartel orders his death to ensure there'll be no reprisals to worry about in the future. But young Sujo is protected by his aunt, growing up in the isolated countryside. The spectre of the cartel is never far away, however: Sujo reaches his teens and is tempted to join the local cartel, and even when he moves to the city, the world of violent criminality is never far away. Will he be drawn back to the life his father lived and died for? Directors Astrid Rondero and Fernanda Valadez create visually distinctive chapters as they tell this complex and immersive story. Comparisons to Richard Linklater's *Boyhood* have been made, and the films are similar not only in that both follow the main character over many years, but also in the extreme empathy and concern each character elicits from the audience. As Rondero and Valadez put it: "In the end, the whole film is a portrait of this young man, Sujo. A portrait but also a promise of the man he deserves to be."

Money is short and her husband, Ivano, is a violent brute who responds to her morning greeting by slapping her in the face. Delia juggles taking care of the home, three children, and a bedridden father-in-law, with scrambling for cash to contribute to the household – and to the pockets of the ever-demanding Ivano. Delia's dream is for her daughter Marcella to marry well and lead a better, more comfortable life – the girl's romance with a boy from a business-owning family bodes well. She finds respite from the violence in a flirtation with an old suitor, Nino (Vinicio Marchioni), and in an unlikely friendship with an American soldier she meets on the streets. A mysterious letter compels Delia to make a momentous, life-altering choice. "I wanted to make a contemporary movie set in the past, because I think that unfortunately many things have remained the same," Cortellesi said. Shot with visual panache in sparkling black and white and with a wonderful soundtrack, Cortellesi has succeeded in making a vibrant, vital film that can lead to change.



Paola Cortellesi is an Italian actress, filmmaker, screenwriter and producer. Cortellesi's portfolio spans nearly 25 years of acting experience in Italian cinema, with credits including Ask Me If I'm Happy (2000) Do You See Me? (2014), and Kidz (2020). Now a 4 x World Champion Para Surfer, Matt shares his experience by offering special blind goggles to Layne Beachley AO that recreate his vision on the waves. 

Set along the border between Belarus and Poland, Holland's (Europa, Europa, SFF 1991; Spoor, SFF 2017) striking black and white film looks at how refugees, lured by false promises, fall under the control of callous border guards and sinister politicians. Green Border follows a Syrian family that comes into contact with a young border guard and an activist determined to help. Oscar-nominated Holland's brilliant direction (in collaboration with associate directors Kamila Tarabura and Katarzyna Warzecha) vividly conveys the terrible moral quandaries faced by these individuals in this urgent film of great political and artistic impact.





A Georgian woman traverses contemporary Istanbul in a tender, soul-searching pilgrimage to find her runaway transgender niece. Berlinale's Teddy Jury Award winner from Levan Akin (And Then We Danced).

To fulfill the dying wish of her sister, retired teacher Lia (a dignified and impressive performance from Mzia Arabuli), sets off on foot to find her estranged niece. Tekla, who fled Georgia at a young age across the border to Türkiye. Before she leaves, Lia gets a lead from the cocky Achi – who himself desires to run away. The unlikely duo set off with little money and only each other for support, to navigate the vibrant, cobbled streets of Istanbul's queer district. This is a road movie, and a personal. introspective journey of reconciliation, instilled with a poetic exploration of marginalised communities abandoning a place that doesn't accept them.

A detective takes on a cold case, the murder of a young woman 15 years earlier. Recalling Bong Joon-ho's *Memories of Murder*, the investigation becomes as much about the broader sociopolitical landscape as an inquiry into individual culpability. Filipino superstar John Lloyd Cruz reprises his role as Lt. Hermes Papauran from Diaz's previous When the Waves Are Gone (SFF 2023), this time investigating a different crime. The director's trademarks are all here: starkly transfixing black-and-white compositions, startling novelistic digressions (including a film-within-a-film fauxdocumentary introducing the missing woman), and an atmosphere that bristles with bracing dissident anger. As with the filmmaker's best work, it's equally meditative and urgent.

His inability to articulate his feelings and his flashes of rage are causing trouble at work and home (his wife and daughter are played by Kupferer's real life family). One day, he stumbles into a local theatre, and before long he's playing Romeo – despite not even knowing the plot. Unexpectedly, this most lamentable and low-budget production provides him an emotional outlet he's never had. Dolly De Leon steals scenes as the cranky but kind veteran actor who plays Juliet. Disarmingly low-key and deeply moving, this lovely indie earned raves at Sundance. You'll want to pack tissues.

Huppert's forensics officer initially finds solace in the company of her new neighbours: young teacher Julia (Hafsia Herzi) and her husband Yann (BPM's electric Nahuel Pérez Biscayart). But she soon learns that Yann is under government surveillance for his direct action against the police force, and finds her allegiances tested by their friendship. One of the most celebrated of the generation of filmmakers who emerged after the French New Wave, Téchiné has worked steadily across seven decades specialising in intimate, absorbing chamber dramas. My New Friends is no exception, treating hot-button subject matter with characteristic sensitivity.

Technically audacious, playfully integrating fiction and nonfiction and in various media, *Pepe* is quite unlike any film you'll see this year.

Torres (*Los Espookys*) plays himself as Alejandro, a zany, softly spoken Salvadoran chasing his lifelong dream of being a toy designer in the Big Apple. When he faces deportation after losing his job, he finds a new role as a PA to art-world doyenne and dragon lady Elizabeth (Swinton). Beside handling her unrelenting demands, Alejandro must also navigate the Kafkaesque bureaucratic nightmare that is the US immigration system before time runs out. Torres' debut blends his trademark absurdist comedy with surreal visual flair and satirical commentary, with cameos from rapper RZA, Greta Lee (*Past Lives*, SFF 2023), and narration from the iconic Isabella Rossellini.

Two married and ostensibly heterosexual friends are unmoored when one of them sleeps with a man and the other begins to question the recurring dreams he's been having, in which David Bowie gazes at him longingly. Dag Johan Haugerud's film is funny but also sincere and compassionate, playing out in a series of long, winding, highly articulate conversations. They're captured by a camera that is fittingly unrestricted, floating between characters mid-scene.

In this traditional society, they face increasingly forceful queries about their childlessness despite years of marriage. Eventually Tithi falls pregnant; what follows is a time of closeness and love. One night, as Tithi is on the verge of giving birth, Fahan goes off to investigate a disturbance in their neighbourhood — and fails to return. This riveting exploration of power becomes a thriller in which the personal is political and vice versa, and Farooki showcases Bangladesh with near-tactile immediacy.

Margolin's spot-on screenplay is packed with zingy dialogue and affecting reflections on what it means to grow old. But there's no syrupy sentimentality here: Thelma is far too busy and determined for that! A dream cast includes Parker Posey, Malcom McDowell and blaxploitation legend Richard Roundtree (*Shaft*, 1971), who gives his final and arguably greatest performance as Thelma's loyal pal Ben. Their dynamic duo act is one for the ages – and the aged.

Maeve Jinkings (*Aquarius*, SFF 2016) is magnetic as Suellen, a motorway tollbooth attendant worried about what the future holds for her openly gay son Tiquinho (charismatic newcomer Kauan Alvarenga). Suellen thinks conversion therapy might be the answer, but paying for it on her meagre wages is impossible. What follows reveals a country in a rapid state of social change, and Markowicz skilfully ratchets up the tension as Suellen becomes an accomplice to highway robbery and events spin out of her control.

Bhutanese director-cinematographer Arun Bhattarai and his Hungarian co-director Dorottya Zurbó explore the very idea of happiness in this endearingly tender film.

This essay-like film features some of the most dramatic footage you're likely to see this Festival, as the camera swoops through ruined buildings and streams of rock tumble slow-mo down the screen. As the dust clears and the camera retreats, you're left to contemplate the nature of our relationship with building materials old and new. Alongside these ravishing images, we meet Italian architect and theorist Michele De Lucchi as he supervises the construction of a stone circle in his rain-swept garden. Another fascinating, immersive film in Russian director Kossakovsky's impressive canon (¿Vivan Las Antipodas!, SFF 2012).

Fanatically dedicated to their outlawed craft, the baloeiros spend years glueing together tissue paper and creating incredible, multi-hued designs, often featuring portraits of their heroes. They compete against each other to build the biggest, most spectacular balloons. It's a seriously macho world — and secretive too, because the baloeiros are pursued by the authorities, who see their activities as dangerous and criminal. Which makes it all the more surprising that a female filmmaker was able to enter their world. It took years for Danish-Spanish director Sissel Dargis Morell to gain their trust. But her doggedness paid off, and the result is gripping, spectacular and infectious.

A powerful film set in Kenya's spectacular Laikipia region, home to traditional herders, wildlife conservationists, and white pastoralists; a place where drought, politics and colonial history collide.

Samburu cattle herders have lived in the region for centuries. Many white landholders were born and raised here. But, after months without rain, once amicable societal relationships are fracturing. In the past, Indigenous herders would have roamed far seeking food and water. But white landholders have erected fences across traditional grazing routes and employed armed guards to protect their property. As the drought deepens and election rhetoric fires up the community, tension escalates. Over five years, Kenyan director Peter Murimi and Greek filmmaker-journalist Daphne Matziaraki skilfully documented this complex, increasingly violent situation, with unresolved colonial legacy meeting climate change head on.

Her parents also discouraged her, knowing their daughter would be stigmatised. Nevertheless, Shiori decided to go public, and was subsequently slandered and forced into hiding. Bravely, she continued her own investigation, exposing Japan's outdated judicial system and patriarchal norms, writing a bestselling book, and eventually directing this film. Shiori's raw and courageous documentary echoes sexual assault cases in our own backyard and makes for timely and essential viewing.

The community is largely tolerant, but the volume of cats and people is beginning to intrude on the serenity of this spiritual environment and a new approach is needed. Soda lived on the island for years, and his intimate familiarity with the locality enables him to capture every detail of this world with humour and tenderness.



The vivacity of the pre-Revolution years lingers on behind closed doors, as though the home is a different planet - but that freedom is increasingly curtailed. She tracks the public and private histories of women: from intimate footage of women singing and dancing, to public protests, including against the mandatory hijab in 1979. Sharifi narrates her own experiences, including the 2022 Woman Life Freedom uprising, which ultimately becomes an act of resistance and a turning point in Farahnaz's life.

Their uncommon alliance begins in 2019, when Israeli Yuval visits Palestinian Basel and his family while reporting on forced evictions. Over four years they become friends, working together and filming as tensions rise following the outcome of the Masafer Yatta community's 22-year court case. Bulldozers move in, destroying homes and buildings. Villagers rebuild — only for the homes to be torn down again. Despite the confronting content, the resulting documentary is not without hope and humanity. *No Other Land* is essential viewing.

As daylight fades, she sets up screens and lights with the help of a local Indigenous man. The duo diligently identifies and tallies the swarming insects, accompanied by the forest's night-time symphony of whirrs and clicks. Co-directors Anirban Dutta and Anupama Srinivasan (*Flickering Lights*, also screening SFF 2024) deftly capture this magical, meditative environment, leaving you mesmerised and awake to all the little things in our natural world.

Since then, his career has encompassed features (Oscar winner *12 Years a Slave*), television (*Small Axe*, 2020), and documentary (*Grenfell*, 2021). In his latest, McQueen traces the wartime history of his adopted city – from the 1940 Nazi invasion to the increasingly brutal repression and deportation of the Jewish population. Narration relates that history as images of modern-day Amsterdam (shot during the pandemic) fill the screen. Based on a book written by McQueen's partner, Dutch writer-director Bianca Stigter (*Three Minutes – A Lengthening*, SFF 2022), this is a challenging but intensely rewarding opus.

Largely narrated by Reeve, from extensive audio recordings made during his lifetime, this moving film received a standing ovation at its Sundance 2024 opening night premiere.

Ed Oxenbould (The Visit) is wonderfully vulnerable as Angus, a middle-class schoolboy desperate to be one of the cool kids on the local music scene in thrall to the sounds of London bands like PiL and Siouxsie and the Banshees. Cutting off his long hair, finagling a bass, and scoring a gig before he even learns to play, Angus stumbles into a thrilling new world with sweet charm and mortifying awkwardness. Márton Csókás (Cuckoo, also screening at the Festival) is stellar as Angus's embittered but understanding dad who is suddenly too bourgeois and establishment for his newly class-conscious son. Filled with warmth and nostalgic detail, Ogilvie has crafted an achingly emotional tribute to an epochal moment in music.





She kept in touch, and in 2017 returned to film a sequel with their help. The resulting hybrid feature focuses on Xhevahire, Gëzim, Shpresim, and Besnik (all credited as co-creators) and is structured in three parts – the 1998-99 war, the quartet's struggles in the present, and their uncertain future. As these former street kids reflect on the war's long-term impact on their lives, audiences are left to consider the unavoidable truth: that today's conflicts will doubtless trigger the same repercussions.



Grimonprez's award-winning documentary (Special Jury Award for Cinematic Innovation, Sundance) homes in on the '60s, when America sent jazz icons Louis Armstrong, Nina Simone, and Dizzy Gillespie as 'goodwill ambassadors' to Africa to distract from the earlier CIA-backed assassination of Congolese prime minister Patrice Lumumba. With stylised flair, the film shows that "America's secret weapon is a blue note in a minor key." Yet jazz wasn't just a decoy. Deftly collaging archival footage and home movies, Grimonprez traces a counter history in which Black American artists protested U.S. imperialism and built international solidarity with decolonial movements.

Whilst she is initially excited at the appointment, Diouana's relocation to Antibes for work uncovers a hidden side to her employers, and she is slowly forced into the role of a domestic slave. *Black Girl* is startling and harrowing, a domestic horror story revealing the injustices of colonialism.

Winner of the Special Jury Prize at Venice Film Festival 1968 and considered the first feature-length film in an African language, *Mandabi* (SFF 2021) is regarded as one of Sembène's most significant works.

Ibrahima Dieng (Makhourédia Guèye) is a lazy, pompous man with two hard-working and obedient wives Mety and Aram (Ynousse N'Diaye and Isseu Niang) and little money. But Dieng suddenly receives a money order from his nephew, a street cleaner in France, for 20,000 francs. He immediately realizes, however, that he cannot cash it because he does not have identity documents, and a bureaucratic nightmare begins. Shot with stark simplicity, this beautifully restored print renders the vivid colours and the 1960s architecture of Dakar utterly tangible.

Set in Sembène's home territory of Casamance, *Emitaï* is a deceptively simple story of resistance and rebellion chronicling historical oppression by the French in West Africa.

During the Second World War, French troops arrive in a Diola village to enlist the men and confiscate the rice. Instead of submitting to the French tax, the women hide their harvest. The situation worsens as the French resort to violence, firing on local villagers. The Diola elders soon decide on the best response to the increasingly harsh French policies: to consult and pray to Emitaï, the god of thunder. An electrifying narrative of rebellion and revolt, *Emitaï* marked the first in a series of films from Sembène on anti-colonial resistance.

Xala (SFF 1976) is a brilliantly funny satire set in post-colonial Senegal, displaying Sembène's scepticism about his country's new dawn after independence from France.

Thierno Laye plays El Hadj, a middle-aged Senegalese businessman who sits on the Dakar Chamber of Commerce. The members of the board have inherited their positions from their departing European overlords — but they're corrupt, quietly bought off with briefcases full of cash. El Hadj decides to marry a third wife, but on the evening of the wedding he suddenly discovers himself impotent (*xala* translates to sexual impotence in Wolof). Thinking he's cursed, he goes to various healers, but without results. Based on the novel of the same name by Sembène, this film upset the government so much that 11 cuts were made before it was released in Dakar.

Ousmane Sembène is considered one of the most important revolutionary artists of his generation. His body of work in literature and film inspired many African filmmakers and defined post-colonial Africa.

Born in 1923 in Casamance, southern Senegal, he was expelled from school in 1936 for indiscipline, and was unable to follow his father's trade as a fisherman, as he was always seasick. He then opted to work as an apprentice mechanic and a bricklayer before he got drafted into the French army to liberate France from German occupation.

After the Second World War, unemployed, Sembène left Dakar and moved to Marseille, where he laboured as a dockworker – resulting in a broken back caused by offloading a ship. He later joined the trade union and worked to educate and liberate a community of mostly illiterate African immigrants working on the dockvard

After 12 years spent working in Marseille as a docker. Sembène returned to his native land, where he devoted most of his time to writing and published 10 novels. He soon realised that his intended audience's level of illiteracy was too high, however, and only a handful of his people were able to have access to his work. At nearly 40. Sembène got a scholarship to study filmmaking at the Gorky Film Studio in Moscow, where he was mentored by the Ukrainian film director Mark Donskoy.

On his return to Senegal, Sembène began experimenting by making films reacting to the poverty and desperate social conditions in his country. Armed with an old Soviet camera that was gifted to him, Sembène directed his first feature film *Black Girl* (1966), the follow-up to his award-winning short film Borom Sarret (1963). He will forever be remembered for ushering in a new wave of African filmmaking.

Historical epic Ceddo (SFF 1978) remains Ousmane Sembène's most controversial film, strongly indicting both Islam and Christianity and showcasing the traditional African religion that came before them.

Set in an unspecified period between the 17th and 19th centuries, the film focuses on the Ceddo - 'the people of refusal' who rejected a regime that has become complicit in the rise of Islamic fanaticism, and the slow but lasting spread of slavery and Euro-American colonialism. 'Ceddo' was the name given to the holders of African spiritualism before it became tinged with Islam or Christianity. When villagers sense that their traditional religion is being threatened by white traders and missionaries, they kidnap Princess Dior and demand an immediate change in the management of the political system.

They arrive at the Thiaroye marshaling camp, on the outskirts of Dakar. But the veterans soon realize that they will be paid much less than they were promised. The men rebel, but this will not stop the massacre that awaits them at the hands of French forces. A searing story with brilliant performances, Camp de Thiaroye chronicles history that should not be forgotten.

Borom Sarret (Wolof name for "wagoner") is the story of a poor cart driver who loses almost everything he owns in a single day. He offers people rides into town, and only sometimes do they pay him the fare. He gets confronted by a rich customer demanding to be taken to a suburb where horse driven carts are prohibited and inevitably the police stop him and confiscate his cart. This portrait of a working man recalls neorealist classics such as *Bicycle Thieves* and marked the arrival of a major new talent.

Guelwaar, a political firebrand, dies mysteriously after a fiery speech. He was an important leader in the fight against foreign aid, the reliance on which he saw as debilitating. Now he is dead, the body is given a wrong tag, and Guelwaar - despite his Catholicism – is mistakenly buried in a Muslim cemetery. His family gathers: a daughter who works as a sex worker in Dakar returns, and an older son flies in from France. A fierce dispute breaks out which underlines the still considerable importance of the ritual and allows Sembène to denounce an Africa that venerates the gifts of foreign benefactors.

NANCY SAVOCA: TRUE LOVE STORIES

As a new generation discovers The Sopranos, Moonstruck, Saturday Night Fever, The Godfather, Raging Bull the iconic films and television about the Italian-American experience in the 20th century — it's a great time to explore that same experience from a female perspective.

Nancy Savoca was born in the Bronx to immigrant parents, an Argentinian mother and a Sicilian father, and raised "full, full, full" Catholic by her own admission. Before she'd even finished film school at NYU, Savoca had already discovered a novel she was determined to adapt for the screen; one that spoke to her life and upbringing so deeply that she considered it biographical.

Ten years later, with two shorts and two features already under her belt, that determination resulted in a film widely regarded as one of the best of the year. In his four-star review, Roger Ebert praised *Household Saints* for being "closer to the literal truth of those days than many non-Catholics will believe." Despite being embraced by critics, the film fell through the cracks in the transition from VHS to DVD and was seemingly lost until a beautiful new restoration through Kino Lorber and Milestone Films — which will make its Australian premiere at the Festival.

Also screening in this program are four more stories of love and heartbreak that confirm Savoca's auteur bona fides: her 1989 Sundance winner *True Love*, 1991's much-loved *Dogfight* starring River Phoenix and Lili Taylor, as well as her newly restored and award-winning '80s short films *Renata* and *Bad Timing*.

This seminal work heralded the arrival of a fresh voice in cinema and marked an important contribution to the '90s indie movement.

As the night unfolds and the cruel game is revealed, Eddie's initial insensitivity gives way to unexpected tenderness as the pair share a night that will remain etched in their memories. The next morning, Eddie ships out to Vietnam. Aided by evocative performances and a soundtrack that captures the mood of the moment (Muddy Waters, Van Morrison, and Pete Seeger), Savoca tells a uniquely arresting love story that has maintained its cult status.

Adapted from a book by Francine Prose that director Nancy Savoca discovered while in film school at NYU, and executive produced by Jonathan Demme, the lauded *Household Saints* missed the transition from VHS to DVD and languished out of print until this beautiful new restoration. Savoca was raised defiantly Catholic, and this is the most personal of her films. Rich with metaphor and packed with layered, against-type performances by the whole cast (including Judith Malina, Michael Imperioli, Michael Rispoli and Victor Argo), the film was shot on a Lower East Side set originally built for Michael Cimino's *Year of the Dragon*. *Household Saints* perfectly captures the spirit and spirituality of the Italian-American experience.



With its atmosphere of mounting dread and eye-popping production design, this journey into Australia's violent car culture marked a stunning feature debut for the great Australian filmmaker Peter Weir (*Picnic at Hanging Rock*, 1975; *Master and Commander: The Far Side of the World*, 2003). Mina (Choudhury) is an Indian immigrant to small-town Mississippi, a humble motel worker whose family was expelled from Uganda by Idi Amin. She meets Demetrius (Washington), the owner of a struggling cleaning business, when they get into a fender-bender. After an awkward start, a tender romance grows as they navigate the complex reactions of their families, the racism of the Deep South, as well as financial hardship. Washington and Choudhury's smouldering chemistry is infectious. Roshan Seth and Sharmila Tagore are outstanding as Mina's parents — their traumatic history, told via flashback, adds unusual richness to Nair's touching, beautifully crafted tale of multiculturalism, familial bonds and defiant love.

When the British press condemned *Peepina Tom*. Michael Powell's career was effectively ruined. In his 1986 autobiography, Powell wrote: "I make a film that nobody wants to see and then, thirty years later, everybody has either seen it or wants to see it." Long championed by filmmakers including Martin Scorsese, this fear-drenched tale of voyeurism and psycho-sexual desire now regularly appears on lists of the greatest British films ever made. Arriving in the same year as Norman Bates in Psycho, Powell's portrait of sociopathic film technician Mark Lewis (a superb Karlheinz Böhm) is a riveting study in what it means to make movies and watch them. Phillip Noyce's milestone escape epic about the Stolen Generations has been breathtakingly restored in 4K. Three extraordinary child actors lead a remarkable cast including David Gulpilil, Ningali Lawford, and Kenneth Branagh.

Western Australia, 1931. Three Indigenous girls are forcibly taken from their family and deposited on a mission school far from home. One day, ordered to empty the latrine bucket, they instead make a run for it, and the rain covers their tracks. David Gulpilil is extraordinary as the tracker on their tail, a trooper whose own daughter is detained at the school, while Kenneth Branagh plays Mr. Neville, determined to force assimilation. But the stars are Everlyn Sampi, Tianna Sansbury, and Laura Monaghan, each giving remarkably unaffected and very moving performances. Haunting and enraging; almost a quarter century since its release, this film is as relevant as ever.

The legendary David Gulpilil narrates this unique mix of docudrama and mythmaking, telling the film's story-within-a-story with great charisma and humour. Gulpilil was also the driving force behind the production, inviting de Heer to the far north to collaborate with Yolngu creatives and actors. Gulpilil's son Jamie stars in a dual role: as Dayindi, a young man learning how to make bark canoes and hunt geese in the wetlands; and as Yeeralparil, the subject of an old parable of jealousy and its consequences. Wonderful performances bring out the playfulness — rarely have myths been this funny — while the hypnotic cinematography, alternating between striking black-and-white and lush colour, creates a sense of oral history coming to life.
